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### Ashley McBryde: Girl Going To The Grammys

When Warner Music Nashville (WMN) released **Ashley McBryde**'s major-label debut on March 30, 2018, the album's title, *Girl Going Nowhere*, set up plenty of stories about the raw singer-songwriter who was, in actuality, headed for great things.

That might not have been apparent by terrestrial radio's reaction—"A Little Dive Bar in Dahlonega" peaked at No. 30 on Country Airplay; sophomore single "Radioland" failed to chart

— but there were other indicators. McBryde was named best new artist when *The Nashville Scene* unveiled its 19th annual Country Music Critics' Poll, she has won the endorsement of high-profile rebels **Eric Church** and **Miranda Lambert**, and demand was so strong when McBryde played Nashville in the fall that the concert had to be moved to a larger venue.

"Girl Goin' Nowhere" heralded yet another girl-headed-somewhere twist when it went to radioland via PlayMPE on Dec. 3. Four days later, Girl Going Nowhere landed among the five Grammy Award finalists for best country

album, a ringing validation of McBryde's tenacity and for a rich body of songs that acknowledges the dark realities of life's hurdles but also manages to find a sliver of dogged hope.

"I still say the sentence every day, just to help it sink in, that 'we're nominated for a Grammy,' " notes McBryde. "It still feels strange."

Whether or not she wins when the 61st annual awards are handed out on Feb. 10, the development changes the underdog dynamic in her career just a hair. McBryde sports a biker-chick level of tattoos, drops an F-bomb or two in a morning chat and

didn't secure the WMN deal until she was squarely in her 30s. Her path didn't follow the standard, primped-up version of femininity that tends to succeed in country.

"Girl Goin' Nowhere" opens McBryde's album in appropriately unconventional fashion—it's a thoughtful, stripped-down folk ballad rather than anthemic rockin' country—that embraces that underdog role.

"I'm aware that I don't have a leg up in this industry," she says. "So 'here we are, and this is what we sound like'—I think it's making a pretty cool statement overall starting the record that way."


Girl Going Nowhere makes its statement with a real attention to craft. Whether documenting a complicated relationship in "Andy (I Can't Live Without You)," creating a ghostly mystery in "Southern Babylon" or belting out a coming-of-age tragedy in "Livin' Next to Leroy," McBryde stocks her songs with a seasoned level of detail: She paints a

handful of mental images, but listeners can still assign their own meanings to the material.

It's a kind of storytelling that suggests she has paid plenty of attention to John Prine, Guy Clark, Kris Kristofferson and Tom T. Hall. It's also a level of expertise that takes years to attain.

"You don't want to put so much furniture in there that you can't walk around," she says metaphorically of the lyrical imagery, "but you definitely need enough to look at and enough to use."

McBryde made her first attempts at music in Arkansas, where she was practically fastened to her guitar and to a radio. She



started writing songs before age 12. Then, as an adult, she moved to Memphis, where she worked as an operations manager at a Guitar Center, a job that didn't dovetail as nicely with her nighttime club performances as it might appear.

"Customer service was not my strong suit at the time," she says with a laugh.
"I got better at it," she adds. "It turns out it wasn't the job I was working. It was who I was working for."

She moved on to Nashville, releasing her first independent EP in 2006 and honing those writing chops while the industry felt—as it does to every hungry artist or writer—like a cruel form of window shopping. She was close enough to the action that she could see all the successful folks; she just wasn't able at the time to step through the door.

"The very first rule of Nashville is you must be present to win, so even though it's hard and it's scary, you're not going to get anywhere if you're not there to do it," she says. "Second rule of Nashville is the guy that quit last is the one that won, so if you have to start out looking through the windows, that's fine, because somebody's going to come up and talk to you at writers nights. You just have to put your roots down and decide, 'I'm going to do this.'"

She made some believers, earned a spot on the roster at WME and got a break when one of her agents mentioned her to Church's manager, Q Prime South founder **John Peets**, who won her over at Nashville's 3rd & Lindsley.

"At showcases, it's like a bunch of used-car salesmen; they all come and try to sell you something in the green room," she notes. "John Peets kind of parts the waters, walks up to me, shakes my hand and says, 'Ilike what you do, I know what to do with it, and I'm looking forward to talking to you.' And he turned around and walked off. It was like, 'Follow that car. That's my guy.'"

They pulled together the *Girl Going Nowhere* album with producer **Jay Joyce** (Church, **LANCO**), then got into a bidding war with labels that McBryde says was "awkward." The meetings were necessary but uncomfortable. However, when she went to WMN, the staff was waiting on bar stools and actually applauded when she strolled into the room. She ended up high-fiving with the crew, and she has been getting a good amount of high-fives from the industry since the album's release, making fans out of Lambert and **Little Big Town**, who booked McBryde to open for the band this year.

"She doesn't need to change anything she's doing," says LBT's **Karen** Fairchild. "The world needs to open up and be exposed to what she's doing."

Fortunately, McBryde seems to have figured that out herself. She spent much of January writing songs for the next album, which she expects to begin recording in May. Her co-writes included appointments with Lambert and  ${\bf Matraca\,Berg}$  ("Strawberry Wine," "You and Tequila"), one of her songwriting icons. McBryde was able to navigate those experiences without fangirling too much and without pressuring herself to land another Grammy nomination.

"That's a really dangerous ledge to stand on if you think about it too much," she reasons. "You're drinking your own bathwater if you were to think like, 'What would Ashley McBryde write?' You've already shot yourself in the foot. I'm very, very excited about the Grammy nomination. [But] that is not allowed to come into the room with me in a write." •

#### Jason Aldean's 'Girl' Extends His Rule On Country Airplay; Dan + Shay Double Up Again Atop Hot Country Songs



Jason Aldean's "Girl Like You" (Macon/Broken Bow) rents the penthouse for a second straight week on *Billboard*'s Country Airplay chart (dated Feb. 9). It pulls in 40.1 million audience impressions (up 2 percent) in the week ending Feb. 3, according to Nielsen Music.

On the airplay-, streaming- and sales-powered Hot Country Songs chart, "Girl" enters the top five, climbing 7-5.

Aldean's 20th Country Airplay leader is the third single and third No. 1 from his album *Rearview Town*, which debuted atop the all-genre Billboard 200 and Top Country Albums charts in April 2018.

"Girl" marks his third straight multiweek leader on Country Airplay. It follows "You Make It Easy," which led for two weeks starting on the May 5, 2018-dated list, and "Drowns the Whiskey" (featuring Miranda Lambert), which dominated for two frames starting in August 2018.

Aldean is the first artist to rattle off three such Country Airplay chart-toppers since **Brett Young**, whose "In Case You Didn't Know" paced the survey for two frames beginning June 10, 2017, followed by "Like I Loved You," which led for three weeks beginning Jan. 3,

2018, and "Mercy," which claimed the summit for two frames last August. (Young's latest single, "Here Tonight," rises 19-16 on the tally, up 13 percent to 15.7 million in radio reach.)

Meanwhile, the last artist to produce more than three consecutive multiweek leaders on the chart is **Blake Shelton**, who landed five in a row. He was in the middle of a streak of 17 straight No. 1s at the time (counting only officially promoted, non-seasonal singles), a run that started with 2010's "Hillbilly Bone" (featuring **Trace Adkins**).

Shelton's five successive multiweek No. 1s began with 2011's "Honey Bee" (four weeks) and continued with "God Gave Me You" (three, 2011), "Drink on It" (two, 2012), "Over" (two, 2012) and "Sure Be Cool If You Did" (two, 2013).

STILL HOLDING AT TWO FOR TWO Dan + Shay — the team of Dan Smyers and Shay Mooney — hold the top two spots on Hot Country Songs for an eighth

frame, moving to within a week of the record for the most time that an act has simultaneously doubled up at Nos. 1 and 2.

"Tequila" (Warner Bros./WAR) reigns for a second week. On the Feb. 2-dated

list, the song rose 2-1, completing a record 54-week trip to the summit and becoming the pair's second leader. It reached the apex after a 19-week wait in the bridesmaid position (the most time that any title has spent at No. 2 in the chart's history).

The track dethroned Dan+Shay's "Speechless," which ranks at No. 2 for a second week after dominating Hot Country Songs for nine frames.


"Tequila" holds in the pole position while ranking at No. 3 on Country Streaming Songs (10.1 million U.S. streams, up 3 percent) and No. 6 on Country Digital Song Sales (6,000 sold, down 10 percent). The single—which topped Country Airplay for two weeks in July 2018—continues to reap the benefit of pop radio crossover play. The track is No. 19 on Adult Contemporary and No. 21 on Pop Songs after reaching No. 10 on Adult Pop Songs in November 2018.

"Speechless" ruled Country Airplay for four frames starting Dec. 22, 2018, and is just beginning to grow beyond its home format, debuting at No. 39 on the Feb. 9-dated Adult Pop Songs chart.

With Dan + Shay's "Tequila" and "Speechless" at Nos. 1 and 2 on Hot Country Songs, respectively, it marks the second-best such run in the chart's history and the most among duos. **Luke Bryan** controlled the top two slots at the same time for nine weeks in 2014.

"All to Myself" is the pair's newest country radio single and the third from its self-titled third LP. The set debuted as Dan + Shay's second No. 1 on Top Country Albums in July 2018.

BURNING UP Midland banks its second Country Airplay top 10 as "Burn Out" (Big Machine) rises 11-10 (23.4 million, up 2 percent). The song is the trio's third charte single, following its debut, "Drinkin' Problem," which reached No. 3 in 2017, and "Make a Little" (No. 15, January 2018).







#### HAROLD BRADLEY REMEMBERED

When Country Music Hall of Fame member **Harold Bradley** died Jan. 31, the country music community lost a musician who literally "clicked" in the recording studio.

Following his studio debut in a 1946 session, Bradley went on to become one of the most-recorded musicians in any genre, with a hit list that includes **Loretta Lynn**'s "Coal Miner's Daughter," **Alan Jackson**'s "Here in the Real World," **Elvis Presley**'s "(You're the) Devil in Disguise," **Gene Watson**'s "Farewell Party" and **Roger Miller**'s "King of the Road." That's just a tiny fraction of the more than 500 singles that he touched, among countless other album cuts.

A key piece of his recording success came with the tic-tac bass, a technique that uses an electric bass or baritone guitar in unison with a stand-up bass. When the two instruments are played in tandem, they yield a clicking sound that adds an extra percussive element. It's particularly evident in Patsy Cline's "Crazy," where Bradley's tic-tac clicks form a sonic bridge between drummer Buddy Harman and bassist Bob Moore.

Bradley's musical contributions extended well beyond the tic-tac bass. He played banjo on **Johnny Horton**'s crossover hit "The Battle Of New Orleans," offered standard rhythm guitar on a ream of recordings, cut his own instrumental albums, was a long time head of the Musicians Union in Nashville and co-founded the first studio on Music Row, the Quonset Hut, with brother **Owen Bradley**, who is also a Hall of Famer.

His personality was well-suited for his studio role: Bradley was amiable and reserved, but freely showed his enthusiasm. Those are all great qualities for an essential team player, and that tic-tac bass — a key sound that blends in to the casual ear but stands out if you're looking for it — represents him well.

#### **MUSIC NOTES**

CBS viewers saw Tim McGraw perform his new single, "Thought of You," during the Super Bowl pre-game coverage on Feb. 3, but attendees in Atlanta got a bonus: Kane Brown popped out from backstage during McGraw's encore for a spin on "I Like It, I Love It." They weren't the only concert surprises during the last few days. Dave Grohl was an unannounced walk-on for a cover of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" at Zac Brown Band's Jan. 31 Atlanta show.



Brown returned the favor two days later by dropping in on a Foo Fighters concert for a rendition of Black Sabbath's "War Pigs." Back in Nashville, Morgan Wallen and lead-in act HARDY closed a Jan. 31 set at Marathon Music Works with "Up Down"—and with a brief, non-singing appearance by Cole Swindell.

The campaign for PBS' September broadcast of **Ken Burns**' 16-hour documentary *Country Music* has already begun. Tickets will go on sale Feb. 8 for a March 27 concert at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville that celebrates the production with **Rodney Crowell**, **Rosanne Cash**, **Ricky Skaggs**, **Marty Stuart**, **Vince Gill** and **Brenda Lee**, among others. Sony's Legacy imprint also plans to support the project with soundtrack products. It's worth noting that in 2000, Burns' *Jazz* series spawned a five-disc box set and a slate of releases that focused on individual artists. The March concert may also tip a hat to the campaign for *O Brother*, *Where Art Thou?* A pre-release Ryman celebration of that movie's soundtrack in 2000 turned into a live album, *Down on the Mountain*, which yielded its own concert documentary and a multi-artist tour.

Songwriter **Luke Dick**'s success with the **Dierks Bentley/Brothers Osborne** single "Burning Man" is a nice setup for his next act. He co-directed, co-produced and scored a documentary, *Red Dog*, which takes a look at a strip club his mother frequently hauled him to when she performed there while he was a toddler. The film will premiere during South by Southwest, and the annual conference also will feature a performance by Dick's rock band, **Republican Hair**.

Tons of tour announcements were unveiled in the last week, including three overseas jaunts: Michael Ray and Drake White both have March dates set in the United Kingdom, and the Country Music Association plans outreach to Japan with a March 30 Tokyo concert featuring Brandy Clark, Devin Dawson and Lindsay Ell. Zac Brown Band unveiled an itinerary for the Owl Tour that includes three stadium dates, and Chris Young announced a Raised On Country Tour that features Chris Janson and a rotating trio of additional support acts: Jimmie Allen, LOCASH and Dylan Scott. lacksquare



## Dylan Scott Drums Up An Anthem For The Heartland With 'Nothing To Do Town'

The first time **Dylan Scott** performed his new single, "Nothing to Do Town," he wasn't sure what to expect.

The opening line, "It ain't New York City," wasn't intended as a knock on the Big Apple, but the small-town celebration got its first public run-through at the Gramercy Theatre in Manhattan. Would New Yorkers be offended? Could they appreciate a song about livin' in the sticks?

The doubts quickly subsided once he kicked off the song.

"The fans don't really sing my music back to me till it's like top 20 or top 15," he says. "They sang this song back to me like it was already in the top 10 on the chart, which was amazing. It blew me away."

If it seems odd to debut a song about rural life in a venue that's one block from a subway station, the genesis of "Nothing to Do Town" is rooted in a much more likely location: Newton, Iowa, a city of roughly 15,000 people nestled among cornfields and hog farms. Scott played a concert at the Iowa Speedway on July 27, 2018, in conjunction with a NASCAR race, and he brought along songwriter Cole Taylor ("Home Alone Tonight," "Sippin' On Fire") and songwriter-producer Matt Alderman to write during his down time. They wandered to the town square during the day in search of food and took a good look at the surroundings.

"Somebody said, 'Man, this is a nothin' to-do town,' and I said, 'Yeah, it kind of reminds me of my town,' "recalls Scott. "Cole was like, 'Yeah, it reminds me of my town, too,' so that's when we knew we had to write 'Nothing to Do Town.'"

Back on the bus, Taylor whipped into a bright set of chords on guitar while the trio free-wheeled images from a typical American heartland town. Scott naturally drew on Bastrop, La.; Taylor flashed on his experiences in Cuthbert, Ga.; and Alderman — who grew up in the suburbs of Chicago — applied a little imagination.

The chorus centered on a makeshift party — stocking up on beer, building a fire on the outskirts of town and turning up some country music to raise a ruckus into the night. Scott recognizes the scenario has been used before, but if he's being honest about his life, that's a realistic part of it.

"I grew up in a town where we had a McDonald's and a Walmart," notes Scott. "We rode around and listened to music, we usually ended up at somebody's house or somebody's farm, and you lit a fire and sat around it and once again listened to music. That's what we did."

That's true for Taylor, too, though Alderman's suburban experience was a tad different.

"We were definitely more like basement parties," he says.

As the chorus neared its conclusion, Alderman spit out, "Who says there's nothin' to do/Who says there's nothin' to do," and it led into a staccato finale: "In this. Noth-in'. To. Do. Town." When they pieced together the work tape, Alderman emphasized those words with a slammin' drum sound.

"That kind of quick, rapid thing at the end," says Taylor, "to me, makes that whole song."

With the chorus completed, they worked up the verses, leading with that "It ain't New York City" opening, followed by a mention of Los Angeles and a quick nod to Nashville's downtown club scene: "We ain't got no rooftop bars/Like they do on Broadway." They made the town really small—"Ain't big enough to be a map dot"—but instead of moaning about the circumstances, they played them up as a happy existence.

"I love the line where he's working and playing and cussing and praying," says Taylor. "It kind of ties it all in a bow and puts the lifestyle into one simple line. It seems like a T-shirt for a small town."

Alderman broke out the laptop after they had finished writing it to create a quick work tape. He provided backing vocals, Scott laid down a vocal, and the

file got sent to Nashville keyboard player Alex Wright for some additional work. Wright came up with a spry lick for the intro—it eventually would get converted to a guitar part—and he threw in a whirling, glittery effect at the end of the first verse that operates much like the synth flourishes in Irene Cara's "Fame" and The Weather Girls' "It's Raining Men."

Back in Nashville, Alderman and co-producer Jim Ed Norman (Anne Murray, Hank Williams Jr.) built up the track one instrument at a time.

"We've kind of been doing that with a lot of the songs that we've been doing with Dylan lately, instead of waiting and cutting five or six songs at once," says Alderman. "If we have one song we really love, we'll get back to town and overdub some drums and bass, maybe go get some pedal steel, maybe get some final vocals as fast as we can."

Ilya Toshinsky overdubbed the final guitars, and the drummer from Scott's road band, Darrick Cline, added live percussion atop the

programmed parts. It was written with a **George Strait** reference in every chorus, but Scott amended it along the way. The third verse substituted a shout-out to fellow Louisianan **Tim McGraw**, and Scott worked through several other options for the middle verse with Norman before they settled on **Brooks & Dunn**.

Just as the small-town lyrics had to appeal to big-city dwellers if "Nothing to Do Town" was going to be a hit, the track also needed to blend Scott's musical roots with the genre's contemporary realities.

"He's cut from country cloth, his father being a guitar player for **Freddie Hart**, being around country music and loving **Keith Whitley** like he does," says Norman. "Those songs [need] to combine his experiences with rock, hip-hop, pop and bring a vibrancy that connects with his constituent base, but never forgetting that he has really got the chops to sing."

Alderman mixed it with that balance in mind, though Scott asked for a couple of new versions, pushing for more prominent guitars that would lend additional energy in his concerts.

"Dylan's big thing was he wanted it to rock," he says.

Curb believed fully in "Nothing to Do Town" as a single. It sounded like a hit, fit Scott's persona and thematically expanded his material beyond the romantic messages of his first two top five hits: "My Girl" (No. 1, Country Airplay) and "Hooked" (No. 2).

"This was bringing yet another dimension to Dylan," says Norman. "That's one of the things, clearly, that I think that every artist longs and hopes for."

Released to country radio via PlayMPE on Dec. 4, it debuted on the Country Airplay chart dated Jan. 26 and is now at No. 48 in its third week. And as the *Nothingto Do Town* tour unfolds, Scott has quickly discovered that concertgoers in every town are singing it back verbatim with a special emphasis on those slammin' drums.

"From the very first line of the song, people are singing it, which is kind of crazy, because they usually just sing the chorus," he says. "But when you get to [the drums at] the end of the song, they really step up. It's hooky."

#### **RANKINGS**

Country Airplay is ranked by total audience impressions for the week ending Sunday based on monitored airplay of 149 stations by Nielsen BDS. Audience totals on the chart are derived, in part, using certain Arbitron Inc. copyrighted Persons 12+ audience estimates (under license © 2019, Arbitron Inc.) Country Indicator is tabulated using reported playlists and Nielsen BDS-monitored airplay at 109 stations, ranked by total plays.

#### **BULLETS**

 Awarded on Country Airplay to titles gaining audience or remaining flat from the previous week. A song will also receive a bullet if its percentage loss in audience does not exceed the percentage of monitored station downtime for the format. Titles that decline in audience but increase in detections will also receive a bullet if the total audience erosion for the week does not exceed 3%. Bullets are awarded on Country Indicator to titles gaining plays or remaining flat from the previous week.

#### TIES

On Country Airplay, if two songs are tied in total audience, the song with the larger increase in audience is placed first. On Country Indicator, if two songs are tied in total plays, the song with the larger increase in plays is placed first.

#### **RECURRENTS**

On Country Airplay, descending titles below No. 10 in either audience or detections are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks, provided that they are not still

gaining enough audience points to bullet or if they rank below No. 10 and post a third consecutive week of (non-bulleted) audience decline, regardless of total chart weeks. On Country Indicator, descending, non-bulleted titles below No. 10 are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks or if they post a third consecutive week of decline in plays after 10 weeks.

#### **HOT SHOT DEBUT**

Awarded to the highest-ranking new entry on Country Airplay and Country Indicator, respectively.

#### **MOST ADDED**

The total number of new adds officially reported to Billboard by each reporting station, or by an automatic-add threshold (seven plays for the first time in a chart tracking week, according to Nielsen BDS) for stations that do not report adds.

#### MOST INCREASED AUDIENCE/ PLAYS

Most Increased Audience on Country Airplay and Most Increased Plays on Country Indicator list the songs with the greatest week-to-week increases in total audience or plays, respectively.

#### **AIRPOWER**

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles ranking inside top 20 in plays and audience rankings for the first time, with increases in both plays and audience.

#### BREAKER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles achieving airplay (at least one detection) at 60% of reporting stations for the first time.

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### 40 Years Ago Eddie Rabbitt Found His 'Way' To No. 1

His fourth Hot Country Songs leader was powered by a hit Clint Eastwood movie On Feb. 10, 1979, Eddie Rabbitt's "Every Which Way But Loose" topped *Billboard*'s Hot Country Songs for the first of three weeks.

Penned by Steve Dorff, Milton Brown and Snuff Garrett, "Loose" served as the theme of the movie of the same name starring Clint Eastwood as trucker Philo Beddoe and his pet orangutan, Clyde. Fueled by the film's success, the song hit No. 30 on the all-genre Billboard Hot 100, becoming Rabbitt's first of eight career top 40 hits on the list.

"Loose" was the fourth of Rabbitt's 17 Hot Country Songs No. 1s (among 34 top 10s) through 1990. He first topped the chart with "Drinkin' My Baby (Off My Mind)" in 1976.

Rabbitt, who originally hailed from Brooklyn, moved to Nashville and worked as a trucker, among other jobs, before breaking through as a songwriter when Elvis Presley recorded "Kentucky Rain," a No. 16 Hot 100 hit in 1970 that Rabbitt coauthored with Dick Heard. Rabbitt also solo-penned Ronnie Milsap's first of 35 Hot Country Songs No. 1s, 1974's "Pure Love."

Rabbitt died in 1998 at age 56 after battling lung cancer.
