'One For The Books': Naomi Judd's **Death Informs The Country** Hall Of Fame Induction

Coming one day after Naomi Judd's tragic death, the May 1 Country Music Hall of Fame induction ceremony took on an

The Judds were ushered in as one of four new members.

Wynonna Judd, making her acceptance speech with sister Ashley Judd beside her, looked determinedly toward the future.

"Though my heart's broken," she pledged, "I will continue to sing.'

Ashley, speaking through the family's personal grief, congratulated the night's other inductees - Ray Charles ("so iconic and archetypal"), steel guitarist Pete Drake and drummer Eddie Bayers - then addressed the dozen or so existing Hall of Fame members who attended the ceremony, as well as the room at large.

"My mama loved you so

unusually dramatic air as

much, and she appreciated your love for her," said Ash-







ley. "I'm sorry that she couldn't hang on until today." Given the time frame, it was the most profound example of

the ever-present threat that accompanies the Hall of Fame's mission. By honoring significant contributors to the country music community for a lifetime of work, it necessarily hails many of those figures when their 4 health is declining. Some, like Naomi, don't quite make it to the ceremony.

Jim Ed Brown, in one of the best-known examples, was presented his medallion in a Tennessee hospital bed in June 2015, four months before The Browns were inducted. Further complicating that year's plot, **Bonnie Brown** announced she had stage IV cancer in September. Hall's membership. He at least had the satisfaction of knowing she had reached that plateau since the class was announced 29 days prior to his passing. Similarly, **Tammy Wynette** died in April 1998, two months before she was announced as a new member. She had been informed of her election, and was actually holding that knowledge secret at the time of her death.

Passage, of course, elicits sympathy, and the Country Music Association (CMA) instituted a one-year ineligibility period after a non-member's death to make sure Hall inductees are recognized for the quality of their lifetime contributions to country music rather than for the heart-tugging immediacy of their life's end.

The new class is made of artists and musicians who mastered space and time within their work. The Judds' approach to country leaned on acoustic instruments to create a simple-but-effective bed for Wynonna's soul-flecked lead vocals and the duo's mother/daughter harmonies. Charles often left gaping holes between his vocal phrases, creating anticipation for the forthcoming lines in the material. Bayers became an A-lister by keeping solid time on the drum kit while calling minimal attention to his essential rhythm tracks, exemplified during the ceremony by **Medallion All-Star Band** drummer **Jerry Pentecost**, who applied brushes to **Vince Gill**'s performance of "When I Call Your Name" and swatted cymbals with his hands during **Trisha Yearwood**'s "Walkaway Joe." Drake was hailed for his judicious ability to fit key steel parts into a recording without overwhelming the song or the singer.

"He had an identifiable sound," fellow musician **Charlie McCoy** said in his induction speech. "And he did it at the right places. He became part of the records that he was on. Can you imagine 'Stand By Your Man' without that steel part? I cannot imagine it."

Further emphasizing space, the evening's 11 live performances were all ballads — the fastest tempo was **Marty Stuart**'s closer "Will the Circle Be Unbroken" — and that allowed attendees to mull the significance of the songs as they unfolded. The bulk of the material addressed the kind of painful topics that are historically central to country's mission: broken hearts, unrequited love, cultural disintegration or death.

Mortality, in fact, inhabited three of the night's songs, placing those classics in a different context. **Wendy Moten**'s powerful rendition of "He Stopped Loving Her Today" — honoring Drake, who played on **George Jones**' hit version of the song — is set at a funeral for a man who is finally freed from a decadeslong passion for an old flame. **Garth Brooks**' "Seven Spanish Angels" — a cover of a duet Charles performed with **Willie Nelson** — enlists a sort of Western *Romeo & Juliet* tragedy, with both lovers gunned down and welcomed into the celestial realm. "Will the Circle Be Unbroken," the traditional medallion ceremony finale, pictures an undertaker delivering a deceased mother to her final resting place.

In one of music's paradoxes, addressing the hurt through those songs provided comfort by recognizing loss as a familiar life hurdle.

"As our community grieves, we look to love and the healing power of country music to ease our pain and calm our minds," CMA CEO **Sarah Trahern** said. "As a community, we need comfort in the honored traditions that are the very foundation of this event, to share stories and lift up Wynonna and Ashley because we lost an industry icon, but they lost a mother."

Charles, who was best known for his forays into soul and jazz, may have seemed an unusual Hall of Fame choice to some observers from outside the genre, but his 1962 album *Modern Sounds in Country and Western Music* was a watershed for country, topping the *Billboard* album charts and recasting the songs with big-band and string arrangements in the midst of the civil rights movement.

"His recording exposed a whole new generation to country music," said Ray Charles Foundation president **Valerie Ervin**. "Country music was the core of Ray Charles' life. His love and appreciation for the genre can never be overstated, and its influence also helps shape his storytelling in other genres."

"Everybody tries to mimic Ray Charles," **Ronnie Milsap** said in his induction speech. "You can't do it. There was one of him, and only one."

In the 61 years since the CMA established the Hall of Fame, this latest induction ceremony was likewise the only one quite like it.

"Every medallion ceremony is special, no doubt," said Stuart, "but tonight is one for the books." •

Georgia On His Mind: Jason Aldean Debuts On Top Country Albums; Walker Hayes' 'AA' Hits Country Airplay Top 10

Jason Aldean's *Georgia* (Macon/Broken Bow/BMG) debuts at No. 2 on *Billboard*'s Top Country Albums chart (dated May 7). Released April 22, the set earned 26,000 equivalent album units, with 13,000 in album sales, in the week ending April 28, according to Luminate.

The 15-track *Georgia* bookends Aldean's album *Macon*, which is named after the artist's hometown. The latter, which also includes 15 songs, arrived at its No. 3 Top Country Albums high in November 2021 (37,000 units); *Macon* ranks at No. 33 on the latest list (6,000 units, up 8%).

While *Macon* and *Georgia* were released independently of each other, the combined LP *Macon*, *Georgia* includes all 30 tracks and is available exclusively on vinyl. The package sold 1,200 copies in its first tracking week, ending April 28.

On Top Country Albums, *Georgia* gives Aldean his 11th top 10, all of which have debuted in the tier. His ninth full-length, 9, opened atop the chart in December 2019, awarding him his seventh No. 1. It was his sixth album to enter at the summit.

Before that, Aldean's *Rearview Town* launched at No. 1 on Top Country Albums in April 2018. It followed his other No. 1 debuts: *They Don't Know* (October 2016), *Old Boots*, *New Dirt* (October 2014), *Night Train* (November 2012) and *Relentless* (June 16, 2007, with 982,000 sold, marking Aldean's biggest sales week).

Aldean's additional chart leader, *My Kinda Party*, debuted at No. 2 in November 2010 and hit No. 1

the following February. As for his other top 10s, his self-titled first entry debuted and peaked at No. 6 in August 2005, while *Wide Open* entered at its No. 2 peak in April 2009.

Georgia is unable to bump **Morgan Wallen**'s *Dangerous: The Double Album* (Big Loud/Republic) from No. 1 as the latter reigns for a record-extending 56th week (51,000 units, up 1%). On the all-genre Billboard 200, *Georgia*

begins at No. 8. It marks Aldean's 10th top 10, a total that includes four No. 1s. Concurrently, the latest single from *Georgia*, "Trouble With a Heartbreak" (Macon/Broken Bow), hits the top 10 on both the multimetric Hot Country

Songs chart (surging 11-5) and Country Airplay (14-10). The song drew 8.2 million U.S. streams (up 67%) and sold 1,200 downloads in the tracking week; it scales Country Airplay with a 16% gain to 15.7 million in audience. The track is Aldean's 36th top 10 on Hot Country Songs and his 35th on Country Airplay.


"Trouble" follows *Macon* single "If I Didn't Love You," with **Carrie Underwood**. The duet dominated Country Airplay for three weeks starting in October 2021, becoming Aldean's 24th No. 1 and Underwood's 16th. It entered at its No. 2 peak on Hot Country Songs last August.

'AA' ASCENDS Walker Hayes' "AA" (Monument) becomes his third Country Airplay top 10 as the song pushes 11-9 (16 million, up 6%).

"AA," which Hayes co-wrote, follows his viral smash "Fancy Like," which topped Country Airplay for one week last November and commanded Hot Country Songs for 24 frames beginning last July, marking his first leader on both surveys.

Hayes earned his first top 10 on both Hot Country Songs and Country Airplay in 2018 when "You Broke Up With Me" hit No. 9 on the former and No. 10 on the latter.

'TOMORROW' LEADS TODAY Luke Combs scores his seventh No. 1 on Country Digital Song Sales and makes his sixth entrance in the penthouse as "Tomorrow Me" (River House/Columbia Nashville/Sony Music Nashville) debuts with 5,400 downloads sold. On Hot Country Songs, it starts at No. 13. The song, which also arrives as Combs' 25th top 10 on the tally, is from his third LP, *Growin' Up*, due June 24.

RANKINGS

Country Airplay is ranked by total audience impressions for the week ending Sunday based on monitored airplay of 148 stations by Luminate, formerly MRC Data. Audience totals on the chart are derived, in part, using certain Nielsen Audio- copyrighted Persons 12+ audience estimates (under license © 2022, Nielsen Audio). The list of all Country Airplay chart reporters can be viewed on Luminate, formerly MRC Data's platforms.

BULLETS

• Awarded on Country Airplay to titles gaining audience or remaining flat from the previous week. A song will also receive a bullet if its percentage loss in audience does not exceed the percentage of monitored station downtime for the format. Titles that decline in audience but increase in detections will also receive a bullet if the total audience erosion for the week does not exceed 3%.

TIES

On Country Airplay, if two songs are tied in total audience, the song with the larger increase in audience is placed first.

RECURRENTS

On Country Airplay, descending titles below No. 10 in either audience or detections are moved to recurrent after 20 weeks, provided that they are not still gaining enough audience points to bullet or if they rank below No. 10 and post a third consecutive week of (non-bulleted) audience decline, regardless of total chart weeks.

HOT SHOT DEBUT

Awarded to the highest-ranking new entry on Country Airplay.

MOST ADDED

The total number of new adds officially reported to Billboard by each reporting station, or by an automatic-add threshold (seven plays for the first time in a chart tracking week, according to Luminate, formerly MRC Data) for stations that do not report adds.

MOST INCREASED AUDIENCE

Most Increased Audience on Country Airplay lists the songs with the greatest week-to-week increases in total audience.

AIRPOWER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles ranking inside top 20 in plays and audience rankings for the first time, with increases in both plays and audience.

BREAKER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles achieving airplay (at least one detection) at 60% of reporting stations for the first time.

COUNTRY SHOWS UP IN COMING MONTHS

With masks disappearing in most public spaces and the latest mutations of COVID-19 dropping in severity, concert bookings are exploding for the remainder of 2022.

In the last week alone, as **Carrie Underwood**, **Maren Morris** and **Thomas Rhett** helped carry out the Stagecoach Country Music Festival in Indio, Calif., **Garth Brooks**, **Luke Bryan** and **Darius Rucker** joined a bundle of other acts unveiling tour plans and festivals from May through November.

Not that the pandemic is entirely over — **Chris Stapleton** and **Brandi Carlile** were both forced to cancel appearances in the last two weeks when the virus hit their crews. But receding consequences and isolation fatigue are definitely benefiting country artists' calendars.

Among the new live developments:

• Jake Owen launches the 34-date Up There Down Here Tour on May 5 in Troy, Ohio, playing a hodgepodge of fair dates, festivals, arenas and amphitheaters.

• The Cadillac Three announced a May 18 performance at Nashville's Mercy Lounge, playing one last date in the club before its lease expires. Cannery Row, the complex that houses the venue, is planning to renovate this summer before reopening. It will remain a music site, according to Axios.com.

• Brooks revised the schedule for his ongoing stadium tour. He added a May 20 show at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass., ahead of a May 21 date; similarly turned a Salt Lake City stop into a two-night stand June 17-18; and slated a June 25 date at Commonwealth Stadium in Edmonton, Alberta.

• The Country Music Association unveiled its lineup for evening concerts at Ascend Amphitheater June 10-11, running concurrently with shows at Nissan Stadium. Ascend acts include LANCO, Mitchell Tenpenny, Cole Swindell and Shy Carter.

• Vince Gill booked four straight nights at Nashville's historic Ryman Auditorium Aug. 4-7 with Wendy Moten opening.

• Jimmie Allen enlisted Lainey Wilson, Chayce Beckham and Neon Union among the support acts for his second annual Bettie James Fest on Aug. 13 in Milton, Del.

• Luke Combs unveiled a series of fall dates for his Middle of Somewhere Tour, beginning Sept. 2-3 in Bangor, Maine.

• Bryan presents his 13th Farm Tour, playing makeshift stages in rural fields across six Midwestern states from Sept. 15-24. He's joined by Jameson Rodgers, Riley Green, The Peach Pickers and DJ Rock.

• Rucker introduces a Riverfront Revival in Charleston, S.C., Oct. 8-9 with a lineup that includes **Brothers Osborne**, **Trampled by Turtles** and **Charley Crockett**.

• George Strait slotted concerts Nov. 18-19 at Dickies Arena in Fort Worth, Texas, with opening act Tenille Townes.



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Jelly Roll Introduced To Country With The Dark 'Son Of A Sinner'

The opening lines to Jelly Roll's "Son of a Sinner" are, on first listen, a little awkward, but they also underscore one of the odd truths of art: sometimes the most impactful stuff is also the most uncomfortable.

Those introductory lines — "I never get lonely/I got these ghosts to keep me company"-use off-balance phrasing, wedging the three-syllable "company" into a space where only one syllable belongs. But they're also challenging at a deeper level because ghosts don't generally provide friendship. Instead, they haunt the conscious world and create mysterious, inexplicable disruption.

On repeated listens, that opening salvo is essential to "Son of a Sinner," with the discomfort setting the scene for a moody, intentionally uneasy, journey.

"It goes back to right and wrong," says Jelly Roll aka Jason DeFord. "Everything about it was wrong but felt so right."

Indeed, navigating the divide between "right and wrong," the full-circle, final phrase in the song's anthemic chorus, is at the heart of "Son of a Sinner," an abstract assessment of an addict's emotional battle. The song was crafted after an unexpected visit from a guest.

Jelly Roll had rented Nashville's Sound Emporium - a historic studio that has hosted key sessions by Alan Jackson, Kenny Rogers and Waylon Jennings - to do informal songwriting with visitors dropping in on short notice. Longtime collaborator David Ray Stevens had already spent over eight hours with Jelly Roll when singer-songwriter ERNEST showed up on a Saturday night in 2021 while picking up barbecue for dinner with his wife. Stevens loaned ERNEST his guitar, set up with a drop-D tuning that sounds more weighty than the standard tuning.

"I came in half-buzzed, my shirt was unbuttoned, sat down, picked up a guitar, they put a Voice Note on, and I kind of spit out that chorus," ERNEST recalls. "We messed around with a verse for like 20 minutes, and then I left."

"When Ernest was finished and handed me my guitar back," continues Stevens, "he was like, 'I don't know where that came from, but I'm glad they sent it to us.' He just kind of looked at it like something from above entered the room and made that spill out."

ERNEST's chorus provided a big-picture cry from the soul, a determined move forward for an embattled man who's "one drink away from the devil." But once ERNEST split, Jelly Roll was left to build verses that feel much like a counselor's couch.

"The verses, I wanted Jelly Roll's handprints all over," ERNEST says, "for him to be him."

The opening stanza puts him out on a lonely highway, a scenario that accentuates his life as a traveling musician. The second verse finds him tempted by pills, promising it will be his last time to indulge, though he quickly concedes he's "lying to myself again." The struggle is all internal, a bit ethereal and definitely personal.

"There's points in the song where it becomes extremely autobiographical," says Jelly Roll. "Some music's meant to be heard, and some music is meant to be felt. Personally, I try to make the kind of music that's meant to be felt."

It all worked up to a bridge that's full of meaning and metaphor - mistakes, pain, a string of vices and a confession to God: "At first He's gonna hate me/ But eventually He'll save me." That references Jelly Roll's own musical past -he cowrote a gold single, "Save Me," with Stevens - and wrestles with the judgment prevalent in many religions.

"There's definitely an eerie kind of hopeless, yet hopeful, vibe [in] the whole track," Stevens says. "I think that's where a lot of Jelly Roll's music connects, you know. He's a person who came from the bottom, and a lot of his audience comes from the bottom. I think that's why country music is lending their ear to him and accepting it."

Once Jelly Roll and Stevens finished it, they partied with a few other driveby guests until roughly 3 or 3:30 a.m., when Jelly Roll decided to record the "Son of a Sinner" vocal.

"I was heavily intoxicated and stoned," he confesses.

"That, I can promise you, was the truth," adds Stevens. "No one pours a shot larger than Jelly Roll."

Jelly Roll moved into the vocal booth and sang along with a guitar track ERNEST had created before he left. The room got quiet as Jelly Roll, his inhibitions likely dimmed by the alcohol, put his entire being into the performance.

"I remember it being a very emotional moment," he says. "And I remember getting goose bumps as soon as I came in and sang, 'I never get lonely/I got these ghosts to keep me company.' There was just a chill bump that ran through my body. It's one of the few times I've ever had a song in the studio that I knew was going to be special."

Newly signed at the time to Stoney Creek, he took it to BMG Nashville president of recorded music Jon Loba, who gave it an enthusiastic thumbs-up and encouraged Jelly Roll to find the right producer for it. He enlisted ERNEST, who in turn asked guitarist Ilya Toshinsky to help with the process.

ERNEST lobbied for a minimalistic, rockleaning track, mixing a Jason Isbell influence with mainstream country-rock sensibilities. The musicians delivered it while relying on power-chord

structures that allowed the crew to give a major-key song a minor-key tone, and the band reached its apex at the bridge, with bassist Craig Young ripping through a flurry of notes uncommon in the country genre.

'Craig literally got hospitalized right after we cut this song," recalls Toshinsky. "He was complaining of stomach pain. He thought he would be fine, but as the last chord was ringing out, he was leaving to go check himself into the ER. Two days later, he got diagnosed for COVID-19. He had a horrible couple of weeks there, but Craig, he's so expressive on the bass."

Toshinsky overdubbed razor-like slide guitar at a later date, and ERNEST and Jelly Roll aced the ghostly foundation with a series of low, medieval vocal notes.

Toshinsky also asked drummer Shannon Forrest to redo the original percussion track, mostly to take advantage of the sound at Forrest's home studio. He used brushes instead of sticks, with the performance further enhancing the song's ghostly undercurrent.

"There's some nice tom work that Shannon did that [exploits] this amazing, spacious room with super-high ceilings, so when he hit the drums, there's this resonance that's just unreal," Toshinsky says. "Buckley Miller mixed this thing, and Buckley did a great job just capturing that ambience."

"Son of a Sinner" started on rock radio, reaching top 20 on the Hot Rock & Alternative Songs chart after 18 weeks. Enough country stations picked it up that "Sinner" debuted on the Country Airplay list dated March 12, ahead of its March 31 release via PlayMPE. It lifts to No. 28 in week nine on the survev dated May 7.

"The music we make is extremely cathartic," says Jelly Roll. "I meet fans every night who tell me some of the saddest stories I've ever heard in my life. If, hypothetically, it was just one person, I could never quit writing these songs. I have a duty to continue to try to touch that one person." •

30 Years Ago Brooks & Dunn Were Over The 'Moon'

In 1992, the duo scored its third of 20 No. 1s

On May 9, 1992, **Brooks & Dunn**'s "Neon Moon" spent its first of two weeks atop *Billboard*'s Hot Country Songs chart. The pair's **Ronnie Dunn** wrote the song, which became the third of four straight career-opening No. 1s from the act's debut album, *Brand New Man*.

The duo of Dunn and **Kix Brooks** has rolled up 20 Hot Country Songs leaders, the most among all duos. **The Judds** come in second with 15.

Brooks & Dunn hung up their boots after their 2010 Last Rodeo Tour but reunited in 2015 to co-headline a residence with **Reba McEntire** at Las Vegas' Caesars Palace.

In 2019, Brooks & Dunn were inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame. The same year, they released *Reboot*, featuring rerecordings of 12 previous hits as collaborations with other artists, including "Neon Moon" with **Kacey Musgraves**. *Reboot* entered at No. 1 on Top Country Albums, becoming the duo's seventh leader.

CMT's *Storytellers* featured the twosome on April 13. Brooks, now 66, and Dunn, 68, are set to kick off their 2022 tour on May 5 in Evansville, Ind. –JIM ASKER
