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Stephen Wilson Jr.'s 'Holler' Extends Country's Violent Thread At A Turbulent Time

When Martina McBride's dramatic "Independence Day" video was in heavy rotation on CMT in 1994, a young Stephen Wilson Jr. became transfixed with its blazing, black-and-white portrayal of domestic violence.

"It hit home for me," Wilson says now. "It was very impactful, because I knew exactly what that song was about. I was living it, so every time that video would come on, I was just locked into it."

The product of a shotgun wedding between two 18-year-old parents who were not, in Wilson's estimation, ready for the responsibility of a child, he ended up in his father's custody in Indiana, following in his dad's footsteps by taking up boxing at age 7. When he visited his mother in a double-wide trailer in Smyrna, Tenn., he witnessed — or simply knew — she was being physically abused by the men who shared her life.

With "Holler From the Holler," a song and video he premiered May 6, Wilson delivers a series of images even more grue-

some - and more graphic - than "Independence Day," with grinding, razor-like guitars providing the soundtrack to a bloodspattering murder by a teenage boy who saves his mother from

"It's utterly real," says "Independence Day" songwriter Gretchen Peters of Wilson's "Holler." "I just believed it from the first chord.'

"Holler" is indeed based on Wilson's real-life experiences, though the murder part is simply a fantasy, a representation of what he thinks would have been a fair outcome for the men who brutalized his mother. Co-authored with Craig Wiseman

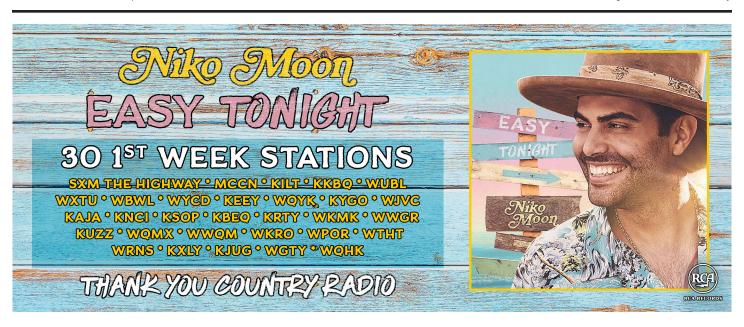
("Live Like You Were Dying," "Summertime"), "Holler" has had an emotional impact on Wilson.

"That song for me ended up becoming very cathartic and very much a healing modality," he says. "When I sing that song live, I feel different each time I sing it — like a little bit better — and if it does that for me, maybe it does it for somebody else. Maybe they'll get out of that situation, instead of just wallowing in it."

"Holler From the Holler" and "Independence Day" are part of a line of violent country songs that extends to the genre's earliest days, when numerous murder ballads—including Fiddlin' John Carson's "Little Mary Phagan," a 1925 recording based on the 1913 rape and murder of a 13-year-old girl - reframed the era's head-

lines. The genre's violent tales include the robberies in **Tim Mc-**Graw's "Don't Take the Girl" and Ricky Van Shelton's "Crime of Passion"; the fistfights in Johnny Cash's "A Boy Named Sue" and Bobby Bare's "The Winner"; the gang rape in Kenny Rogers' "Coward of the County"; the domestic abuse in McBride's "Concrete Angel" and Jason Michael Carroll's "Alyssa Lies"; and the deaths in Garth Brooks' "Papa Loved Mama," Marty





Robbins' "El Paso," Johnny Paycheck's "(Pardon Me) I've Got Someone To Kill" and a series of Carrie Underwood releases — "Two Black Cadillacs," "Church Bells," "Blown Away" and the metaphoric "Little Toy Guns."

"I kill people in my songs," Underwood said with a laugh in 2015. "I have

characters that often are terrible."

Songwriter **Chris Tompkins**, who penned "Blown Away" and the revenge-vandalism classic "Before He Cheats," says he never sets out to create violent narratives, but doesn't resist them either.

"We're just kind of authors writing [mini-] novels," he says. "Sometimes it's a **Stephen King** novel. Sometimes it's a **Danielle Steel** novel."

And while many of those brutal stories are dramatic—similar to **Reba McEntire**'s "The Nightthe Lights Went Out in Georgia" or **Lefty Frizzell**'s "The Long Black Veil"—others can take the same tack as the movie *Pulp Fiction*, painting antisocial behavior

with a humorous brush, as in **Dixie Chicks**" Goodbye Earl" and **Ashley Mc-Bryde**'s "Martha Divine," in which a woman knocks out a rival with a shovel and buries her alive.

The song's challenge, McBryde says, was "trying to make you still want to root for this psychotic young woman that obviously has murderous intentions. She's rightfully angry, and she's a little bit psychotic, but you still want to make sure everybody's rooting for her at the end."

Violence is not generally a laughing matter, though, and Wilson's "Holler From the Holler" arrives at a timely juncture during National Mental Health Awareness Month. Domestic abuse increased during the pandemic; the Buffalo, N.Y., mass shooting is the latest in a tragic American trend; and more

violence is expected after a forthcoming Supreme Court abortion ruling, according to <u>CBSNews.com</u>.

Violence in music has generated controversy for several decades, particularly with genres such as death metal or drill rap that amplify their messages with dangerous sonics. A 2003 study by the <u>American Psychological Association</u> suggested that violent lyrics can increase aggression in listeners, though it also indicated that those attitudes tend to soften when attention turns after one violent song to less-intense entertainment. Thus, an occasional homicidal track is less likely to have an effect than a steady diet.

"Everybody from my generation just about listened to early gangsta rap stuff, and that stuff's very violent," Tompkins says. "But if you're going to get violent in country—like with 'Before He Cheats' or 'Blown Away'—you kind of have to understand where the girl's head's at."

That's likely one reason why country music, despite its historic strand of vicious material, is rarely mentioned in general discussions about the effects of violent songs.

"With country music, there has often been a kind of morality tale attached to those," Peters says. "At least the guy who murders the girl in the old-time-country murder ballad regrets it — the 'Oh, what have I done' sort of thing. I'm not saying necessarily that's a good thing, but that kind of a song could possibly have a very different effect on someone than something that's just a siren call to go fuck some shit up. I just think there has to be nuance there."

In essence, if the violence is an understandable reaction from a beatendown underdog, it's more likely to be accepted than one in which the brutality is treated by an aggressor as sport.

With "Holler From the Holler," Wilson's protagonist certainly fits that description, and the video includes opening and closing billboards for the National Domestic Violence Hotline, 1-800-799-SAFE, underscoring the intent behind the piece's emotional ride.

"Sometimes you got to show the train hitting the car on the tracks before someone actually moves their car off the tracks," Wilson says. "The 799-SAFE number is moving the car at the end of the video. Or at least the first step."

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Morgan Wallen Continues Historic No. 1 Run On Hot Country Songs; Jason Aldean Scores His 25th Country Airplay Leader



Morgan Wallen banks his record-extending fifth No. 1 debut, and his sixth leader overall, on *Billboard*'s airplay-, streaming- and sales-based Hot Country Songs chart as "You Proof" (Mercury/Republic/Big Loud) blasts in atop the May 28-dated list.

The song marks the singer-songwriter's second No. 1 Hot Country Songs start in as many weeks following "Thought You Should Know."

"You Proof," released May 13 — Wallen's birthday — also starts at No. 1

on Country Streaming Songs and Country Digital Song Sales. The song, which Wallen wrote with **ERNEST**, **Ashley Gorley** and **Charlie Handsome**, and which Handsome and **Joey Moi** produced, opens with 22.4 million official U.S. streams in the week ending May 19, according to Luminate. It enters as Wallen's ninth No. 1 and sixth entrance atop Country Streaming Songs.

The track sold 23,100 downloads and opens as Wallen's seventh No. 1 on Country Digital Song Sales, as well as his fourth leader on the all-format Digital Song Sales tally. It's his sixth and fourth No. 1 debut on the lists, respectively.

As "You Proof" rockets in atop Hot Coun-

try Songs, it dethrones Wallen's own "Thought You Should Know," which drops to No. 6. On the May 21-dated ranking, "Thought" also arrived replacing a Wallen single, "Wasted on You," which holds at No. 2 after leading for two nonconsecutive weeks.

Only 13 songs have premiered atop Hot Country Songs since the survey's start as an all-encompassing genre ranking in 1958 — with Wallen boasting five of them. Prior to "You Proof" and "Thought," his "Don't Think Jesus" launched atop the April 30 list after "Wasted on You," his current single being promoted to country radio from his 2021 release, *Dangerous: The Double Album*, began at No. 1 that January, and "7 Summers" bowed on top in August 2020. His first Hot Country Songs chart-topper, "Whiskey Glasses," completed a 30-week trip to No. 1 in May 2019.

Just one other act has achieved multiple No. 1 Hot Country Songs arrivals: **Taylor Swift**, with "All Too Well (Taylor's Version)" last November and "Love Story (Taylor's Version)" in February 2021.

Meanwhile, *Dangerous* rules Top Country Albums for a record-extending 59th week, up 5% to 55,000 equivalent album units.

Concurrently, "Wasted on You" pushes 7-5 for a new best on Country Airplay (21.3 million impressions, up 11%).



NO 'TROUBLE' AT ALL Jason Aldean notches his 25th Country Airplay No. 1 with "Trouble With a Heartbreak" (Macon/Broken Bow), up 15% to 24.9 million impressions.

The song, which Kurt Allison, Brett Beavers, Tully Kennedy and John Morgan wrote, is from Aldean's double album Macon, Georgia, which was released in two 15-song halves; Macon arrived at its No. 3 high on Top Country Albums last November and Georgia started at No. 2 earlier in May. "Trouble" is from Georgia.

Aldean adds his fourth Country Airplay leader in succession following "Trouble With a Heartbreak" with Carrie Underwood

(No. 1 for three weeks starting last October), "Blame It on You" (one week last July) and "Got What I Got" (one in October 2020).

Aldean, who first crowned Country Airplay with his second entry, "Why," in May 2006, boasts the seventh-most No. 1s dating to the chart's inception in January 1990. Kenny Chesney leads with 32, followed by Tim McGraw (29), Blake Shelton (28), Luke Bryan, Alan Jackson and George Strait (26 each).

'7500' = 59TH TOP 10 Tim McGraw posts his 59th Country Airplay top 10 as "7500 OBO" (McGraw/Big Machine) revs 11-10 (15 million, up 7%). It's his first top 10 since "I Called Mama," which reached No. 2 in October 2020.

McGraw's sum of Country Airplay top 10s, which includes 29 No. 1s, marks the third-best after George Strait (61) and Kenny Chesney (60). ●

RANKINGS

Country Airplay is ranked by total audience impressions for the week ending Sunday based on monitored airplay of 148 stations by Luminate, formerly MRC Data. Audience totals on the chart are derived, in part, using certain Nielsen Audio- copyrighted Persons 12+ audience estimates (under license © 2022, Nielsen Audio). The list of all Country Airplay chart reporters can be viewed on Luminate, formerly MRC Data's platforms.

BULLETS

 Awarded on Country Airplay to titles gaining audience or remaining flat from the previous week. A song will also receive a bullet if its percentage loss in audience does not exceed the percentage of monitored station downtime for the format. Titles that decline in audience but increase in detections will also receive a bullet if the total audience erosion for the week does not exceed 3%.

TIES

On Country Airplay, if two songs are tied in total audience, the song with the larger increase in audience is placed first.

RECURRENTS

On Country Airplay, descending titles below No. 10 in either audience or detections are moved to recurrent after 20

weeks, provided that they are not still gaining enough audience points to bullet or if they rank below No. 10 and post a third consecutive week of (non-bulleted) audience decline, regardless of total chart weeks.

HOT SHOT DEBUT

Awarded to the highest-ranking new entry on Country Airplay.

MOST ADDED

The total number of new adds officially reported to Billboard by each reporting station, or by an automatic-add threshold (seven plays for the first time in a chart tracking week, according to Luminate, formerly MRC Data) for stations that do not report adds.

MOST INCREASED AUDIENCE

Most Increased Audience on Country Airplay lists the songs with the greatest week-to-week increases in total audience.

AIRPOWER

Awarded on Country Airplay to titles ranking inside top 20 in plays and audience rankings for the first time, with increases in both plays and audience.

BREAKER

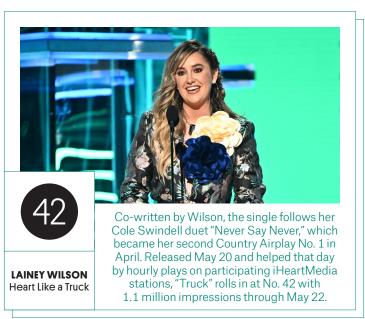

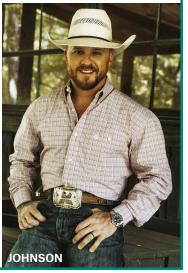

HALL OF FAME'S KILLER CLASS

Jerry Lee Lewis, the late Keith Whitley and Joe Galante, the influential label head who signed Whitley to RCA, were all named May 17 as the 2022 Country Music Hall of Fame inductees in the first in-person hall announcement since

They each took rather unique routes in finding their way to mainstream country significance. Lewis frequented R&B clubs as a Southern youth and broke out as a brash rockabilly star on Memphis' Sun label before focusing specifically on country in the 1960s.

Whitley ventured through bluegrass, playing alongside Ricky Skaggs in Ralph Stanley's Clinch Mountain Boys and with future Diamond Rio mandolinist Gene Johnson in J.D. Crowe & The New South before becoming a traditional country icon.

The Country Music Association revealed the 2022 Country Music Hall of Fame class on May 17. The hall announcement came 16 days after 2021 honorees The Judds, Ray Charles and musicians Pete Drake and Eddie Bayers were officially inducted following a pandemic-related delay. The 2022 class will be celebrated in a medallion ceremony this fall.

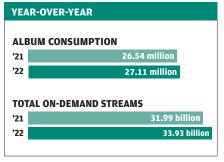

Newcomer John Morgan Emerges 'Right In The Middle' Of Jason Aldean's Label

When NBC launched American Song Contest this spring as a competition between acts from all 50 states and several territories, it cast a few previous hitmakers — including **Michael Bolton** and **Macy Gray** — among its all-genre competitors.

But the show may have also unearthed a future star from North Carolina who has been writing in the shadows in Nashville.

John Morgan is the first signee on Jason Aldean's Night Train label and

has made the most of the association thus far, writing eight songs on Aldean's current *Macon*, *Georgia* double album, including the **Carrie Underwood** collaboration "If I Didn't Love You" and Aldean's current solo single, "Trouble With a Heartbreak."

But in American Song Contest, Morgan introduced his voice with an effectively smooth song, "Right in the Middle," that also played up his home state with a sly reference to a "Tar Heels hoodie" in the chorus. Morgan didn't know it would be a TV competition piece when he wrote it on Nov. 10, 2021, but he was adamant about not giving it away.

"I want to write the best song that we can write today — whether it's for me or for **Thomas Rhett** or Jason Aldean, it doesn't matter," he says. "This specific day, I remember finishing this song and just being like, 'This is something I want to do for my artist stuff.' It was just something I connected to, and it just felt like me."

It should, since Morgan was a driving force at the writing appointment with **Rod**-

ney Clawson ("American Kids," "Dirt"), **Justin Wilson** ("Kiss You in the Morning," "Momma's House") and **Will Bundy**. He came in with the title, a bit of the chorus melody and a general idea that it should be about spending time with a woman he would want to pursue were he not right in the middle of loving a memory.

"I had an idea in my phone that was similar to it that I had been wanting to write," Wilson recalls. "I never really knew how to go about it. And when John came in and brought up 'Right in the Middle' and explained, 'Hey, I ought to love everything about this. I'm just in love with this other girl still,' I kind of spoke up: 'I totally understand this.'"

Knowing where they were headed, they locked onto an opening line, "We're two minutes into a three-minute song," that serves as either a description of background music at a bar or as a metaphor for the time the singer has invested in the evening with a "small-town stunner."

The "Middle" melody was understated, but it fit the protagonist's emotional position, a blend of longing, heartbreak and nostalgia.

The chorus explained that mix, shifting focus from the woman in the room to the woman in the singer's memory, addressed in the first person as he flashes back to the two of them singing along to **Tom Petty**'s "Last Dance With Mary Jane." And he takes note that she "stole my Tar Heels hoodie and a piece of my heart." Tar Heels is, of course, the team nickname for the University of North Carolina athletic department.

"We threw him a little home state love there," Clawson says. "It's funny because artists don't ever come up with that themselves. Songwriters will say, 'Well, if we're going to do a hoodie, who's your favorite team?' 'Tar Heels.' 'OK, well, let's do that Tar Heels hoodie.'"

Just as the chorus seemed it would end, they slid into another section that gently repeated the title four more times, essentially stacking two choruses

back-to-back for an extended set of hooks. It was singalong gold, but it also meant they would be chewing up a big chunk of the standard three-and-a-half minutes they would have for storytelling.

"I was actually worried about that while we were writing it," Wilson says.
"When we got to the chorus, it was going so long, I was like, 'Man, are y'all sure that we need to have it this long? Or are we going to run out of time?' And I had to just trust."

One way they compensated was to cut the second verse in half. That stanza took a bit of conceptual work, too, since the natural tendency would have been to readdress the girl in front of the protagonist. Instead, they had the guy continue pining for his ex, wondering what she's doing now and if she has moved on more successfully than him.

"It took us a minute to figure out we just needed to stick on that," Clawson says. "That's not necessarily the typical way to go, but once the whole chorus is about the girl that he's still in love with, it's kind of hard to flip back to the other girl."

So what happens to that first girl?

"Iwould say from previous experience, she's probably gone," Morgan says with a laugh. "She paid her tab and hit the door, I'm sure."

Aldean co-produced Morgan's recording with two of his band members, guitarist **Kurt Allison** and bassist **Tully Kennedy**. Though they have a fairly identifiable sound as a unit, they were able to supply Morgan with a completely different foundation — no one's

likely to know it's Aldean's team simply from listening.

"That was something we were kind of conscious of," Aldean says. "He's a different artist than I am, and his sound's a little more laid-back and not so rock'n'roll. So that was something we knew we were going to have to do going in, and we just kind of let it happen naturally."

Kennedy, who's one of the genre's more acrobatic bassists, restrained his playing a bit, and Morgan handled the guitar fills himself, even though studio veterans Allison and **Rob McNelley** both participated.

That ultralong chorus also benefited from Aldean's experience. Morgan was challenged at finding the right places to breathe, and Aldean guided him a bit through that process to find a version that would work even beyond the studio.

"He's so good at hearing those stops and breaths and everything," Morgan says. "That's one of the benefits of having him as a part of this team. He knows what it's going to be like performing it live."

Ultimately, after working on the final vocal for "Right in the Middle," they decided a previous vocal he had cut for the demo better captured the song's emotion. As a result, they kept only a few touch-ups from his final session for the master recording.

"He's a pretty flawless singer," Aldean says. "He's not a guy that you have to coach a whole lot in there. That's one of my favorite things about him: He's got really good instincts as far as what he wants to do with the song."

With its Tar Heels reference, "Right in the Middle" was the perfect introduction for the North Carolina contestant on *American Song Contest*. Broken Bow released it on April 17, prior to Morgan's first performance on the show, with plans to work it specifically to country radio at a future date.

"It feels like it's meant to be on radio," Morgan says. "I say that lightly because I know what I'm saying, but it felt the most in that direction to me, and everybody that I played it for has fallen in love with it."

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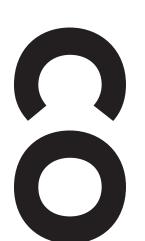

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15 Years Ago

Billy Currington Followed 'Good Directions' To No. 1

In 2007, the hit became his longest-reigning of six Hot Country Songs leaders

On May 26, 2007, Billy Currington's "Good Directions" began a three-week domination on *Billboard*'s Hot Country Songs chart. It became the second—and longest-leading—of his six No. 1s.

Penned by Luke Bryan (who earned his first of seven No. 1s as a writer and his lone leader for another act) and Rachel Thibodeau, the song was released as the third single from Currington's second album, Doin' Somethin' Right, which became his first of five top 10s on Top Country Albums in November 2005. Lead single "Must Be Doin' Somethin' Right" brought him to the Hot Country Songs summit for the first time.

Currington, 48, arrived on Hot Country Songs with "Walk a Little Straighter," which hit No. 8 in November 2003, marking his first of 14 top 10s. In his most recent trip to the tier, "Do I Make You Wanna" reached No. 5 in August 2017; it led Country Airplay the same month, becoming his 11th No. 1.

The Savannah, Ga., native released his seventh album, *Intuition*, last August, his first since 2015's *Summer Forever*, and is now on tour. —JIM ASKER
